This cause came on the day again heard upon the papers formerly read and upon the report of Commissioner  
 Special Commissioner made pursuant to the decree rendered in this court on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 1858 and was  
 argued by Counsel. And it being suggested to the Court that the plaintiff Lucy P. Dow widow of Amos Dow  
 deceased has departed this life since the last decree rendered herein, it is ordered that L R Edwards be appointed  
 next friend of the infant plaintiffs Lucy E. Rose V. and Rosella P. Dow to prosecute same in their behalf  
 and the interest of the said Lucy P. Dow widow as aforesaid in the fund or quantum having terminated by  
 her death, the Court without for the present taking any action upon the said report of Commissioner before above  
 referred to, doth adjudge, order and direct that a Commissioner of this Court take an account showing the  
 persons to and among whom the sum of twelve hundred and nine dollars twenty three cents shown by Commissioner  
 Comptons report to be the net amount of sales made to the said Lucy P. Dow dec'd is now distributable, and in what  
 proportions they are entitled to the same, which account the said Commissioner is directed to have settled and to  
 the Court report together with any matter specially stated, direct payment by himself or which may be required  
 by either party to be so stated -
