This day the court came out again to be heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of Commissioner Griffin made pursuant to the order of the November Term 1857 to which report there is no exception and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court confirming the said report did adjudge, order and decree that Jesse Griffin who is hereby appointed a special Commissioner for that purpose receive from the Clarke Office of this Court the bond returned with his report, collect the same, and out of the money so collected pay as much as may be now due on the debts outstanding against the estate of Wm. H. Griffin reported by Commissioner Horace under the order of the May Term 1857 and of the November Term 1857 and report his proceedings to this Court. But this decree shall be suspended until the said Jesse Griffin shall execute bond in the Clarke Office of this Court with good security in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned faithfully to perform the duties herein imposed him.
