This cause came on this day to be heard on the papers formerly read and report of *Milton P. Butler, Esq., B. P. Butler, and Alfred J. Benjamin*, three of the Commissioners under the decree of this Court 1859, to which report there is no exception and was argued by Counsel for the Plaintiff. On consideration whereof the Court commanding said report doth acquit *John A. Tolson* and *Warren L. Worlton*, who were appointed Commissioners for the purpose, of the charge having advertised the time and place of sale at one or more public places in the neighbourhood of said tract, and also posted notice thereof at the door of the Courthouse of Southampton County, on some Court day previous to the day of sale, till on the sume to the highest bidder, the real estate in the said one or more public places, of which *John A. Tolson* and *Warren L. Worlton*, consisting of three tracts, one containing about five hundred acres, another three hundred and fifty acres and the other tract one hundred and fifty acres (the said tracts to be sold separately) as recommended in the report of the said Commissioners, in a credit of twelve months except so much as may be necessary to defray the expenses of this decree and said sale which shall be for cash; and that *John A. Tolson* and *Warren L. Worlton* with good personal security for the balance bearing interest from that date, and return the bill to the further order of this Court, and that the said Commissioner return said bonds to this court with his report of his proceedings under this decree.

But the said *H. W. Cobb* shall not exceed the decree until he shall execute said in the Clerk's Office of this Court in the penalty of \$5,000 payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia and conditioned for the faithful performance of his trust under this decree and any subsequent decree that may be made in this case.
