 bond and good security from the purchaser or purchasers for the purchase money - and in making
 said sale the said proceeds may be sold in one or several parcels as the Commissioners may
 deem best, retaining the title till the further order of the Court - and make report of his proceedings
 and when paid liable to Court - And the Court doth further adjudge order and decree that as
 Brown's form of this Court's order and report to Court what Court will set of said sale shall
 be paid to Henry S. Butler late the order of Wm. Holmes in law of his order therein and
 make report to Court - And no sale shall be made under this decree until the said shall on or before
 the 1st of January next before the Clerk of the Court a bond payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia and in
 the penalty of \$3000 conditioned for the faithful execution and fulfilment of the duties required of him
 under this decree or that may be required of him under any further decree in this cause -

This day this cause came on to be further heard on the papers formerly filed and on the report of

 A. Everett out of the assets of his intestate pay to the plaintiffs John C. Ingham & wife the sum of
 two thousand three hundred and two dollars and forty six cents (\$2310⁶⁴) with interest
 thereon from December 31st 1858 till paid, and their costs by them in this cause expended - And
 liberty is reserved to the plaintiffs to ask for further relief should this decree prove unsatisfactory -
