Stephenson shall proceed to sue for costs to the highest bidder in public auction after having given at least twenty days notice of the time and place of sale, the interest in the property both real and personal conveyed by the said James M. Bull and wife to him as trustee by a deed of trust bearing date December 27th 1858 (a copy of which is filed as an exhibit) and after paying the expense of this service and said sale pay the debts incurred by said debt of £20.00 and out of the balance pay the said M.
