The bill of the complainant having been taken for confessed as to all the defendants upon whom process had been duly served and they still failing to appear, plead, answer and demur, the cause came on this day to be heard on the bill of the complainant and exhibits therewith filed, and was argued by counsel for the defendant whereof the Court doth approve, order and decree that unless the defendant James M. Bulls within sixty days from the date hereof pay to the plaintiff the sum of \$265. 18 cts. with interest thereon from 1st day of January 1859, a writ of \$20. 50 paid Dec. 10th 1859 to be deducted, as well as all the costs expended by the plaintiff in this suit, that W^m R. Stephenson shall proceed to sell for cash to the highest bidder at public auction, after having given at least twenty days notice of the time and place of sale, the interest in the property both real and personal conveyed by by the said James M. Bulls and wife to him as trustee by a deed of trust bearing date December 27th 1858 (a copy of which is filed as an exhibit) and after paying the expenses of this decree and said sales pay the debts secured by said deed of trust out of the balance, pay the said M. D. Butler the amount specified above, and the balance of any to the said James M. Bulls and make report of his proceedings under this decree to Court. But the said W^m R. Stephenson shall not proceed to execute this decree until he shall have returned into a bond with sufficient security in the Clerk's Office of this Court, conditioned for the faithful performance of his trust under this decree.
