This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of Commissioner Proctor made pursuant to an order of November First 1859 and was argued by Counsel on consideration whereof the Court confirming said report, doth adjudge, order and decree that Joseph Proctor, Jeptha Butler and Williams Ford who are appointed Commissioners for that purpose all to pay to H. Scarborough during his natural life, one third part of the real estate (having regard to quality and quantity) of which he left a trusteed debt subject and professed and make report to this Court. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that in case the heirs at law of Miles Scarborough aforesaid shall in forty days from the date of this decree pay to James P. Butler \$3.80 to Samuel B. Hills \$9.42 to J. B. Hills \$2.20 to Jeptha B. Vick \$1.95 to Jeptha B. Vick \$11.45 to Milton A. Butler \$15.24 to M. D. Butler \$15.86 to W. R. Stephenson \$3.55 to Hills & Stephenson \$8.79 to M. J. Davis \$2.20 to Charles Morris \$6.52 to S. H. Bixby \$20.36 to Samuel Hills \$3.55 to Samuel Hills \$87.42 to A. H. Baker \$28.70 to A. H. Baker \$4.81 to Baker in Scarborough \$73.46 with interest on each of those amounts from April 1st 1858 and the costs of the suits, that H. H. Proctor who is appointed a Commissioner for that purpose, shall after having given at least twenty days notice of the time and place of sale, sell the lands mentioned aforesaid whereof the said Hills' Scarborough died subject and professed subject to the several rights of widow Elizabeth Scarborough to the highest bidder at public auction and after having so much in cash as may be necessary to defray expenses of sale and costs of the suit that for balance of proceeds of sale thereof be taken from the purchased lands with good security payable into the hands of the sufficient security in the blocks Office of this Court in the penalty of \$500.00 payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia and conditioned for the faithful performance of the said terms agreed upon and such other duties as he may be hereafter required to perform in this case under my further decree which may be entered on this cause.
