This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly made and on the report of Commissioner Boyton made pursuant to an order of November Term 1859 and was argued by Counsel On consideration whereof the Court conforming said report doth adjudge, order and decree that Joseph Postlow, Jesse H. Hollings and William Bond who are appointed Commissioners for that purpose all to Elizabeth Scarborough during her natural life one third part of the real estate (having regard to quality and quantity) of which her late husband died seized and possessed and make report to this Court. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that not less than one half of Miles Scarborough dec^d or done one for three shall in forty days from the date of this decree pay to James P. Bond \$15.80 to Samuel B. Kelle \$9.62 to J. B. Kelle \$3.20 to Jesse B. Vick \$1.95 to Jesse B. Vick \$11.45 to Milton D. Butler \$15.52 to M. D. Butler \$15.00 to W. R. Stephenson \$58.55 to Kelle & Stephenson \$8.79 to M. J. Davis \$4.20 to Charles Morris \$6.47 to M. D. Jones \$32.36 to Samuel Kelle \$3.35 to Samuel Kelle \$87.12 to A. W. Coker \$21.90 to A. W. Postlow who is appointed a Commissioner for that purpose shall after having given at least twenty days notice of the time and place of sale sell this land with all its contents, whereof the said Miles Scarborough died seized and possessed subject to the several rights of widow Elizabeth Scarborough to the highest bidder at public auction and after having as much in cash as may be necessary to defray expenses of sale and costs of this suit that for balance of proceeds of sale thereof he shall give the purchaser bond with good security payable within six months with interest from date and return the same with a report of his proceedings under this decree to Court.

But the said W. H. Postlow is not to execute this decree until he shall have given with sufficient security in the Clerk's Office of this Court in the penalty of \$500 or payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia and conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties herein assigned him and such other duties as he may be hereafter required to perform in this case under any and all decrees which may be entered in this cause.
