And this decree shall be read till the said David Bassett shall have reported
in the Clerk's office of this Court bond with sufficient personal security
to the penalty of three thousand Dollars conditioned for the faithful per-
formance of the requirements.
And the said Commissioner acting under this decree is directed to report
his proceedings under the same to the Court.
