Irvington Gardner administrator of Elie Journe the sum of £125. 5*£* with legal interest thereon from April 1st 1860, and to James Handley the sum of £72. 0*£* with legal interest thereon from April 1st 1860, the balance he is directed to pay respectively out to the lawfully qualified guardians of the infant defendants Richard Thomas, Martha & Leonidas Handley and report his proceedings under this decree to Court.
