Dardot since the institution of this suit it is ordered by consent of Dardot & wife that this suit be proceeded in against them accordingly and this case came on to be heard on the bill which has been taken for confessed as to the Defendants Richard and Schell and upon the answers of the infant defendants Joseph & W. B. Barham and of the Defendants Lewis Barham, Martha Barham, Theophilus B. Little and Fanny his wife, John Black and Elizabeth his wife & E. W. Maysenbury administrator of John Barham dec^d and the objections thereto and exhibits and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that one of the Commissioners of this Court take and report the following accounts: 1st An account of the transactions of E. W. Maysenbury as the administrator of the will annexed of John Barham dec^d. 2nd An account of the outstanding debts against the estate of the said John Barham dec^d. 3rd An account of the annual and real value of the real estate of which the said John Barham dec^d seized. 4th An account of what amount is now due John B. Hundred for the land mentioned in the bill - And report the said accounts to the Court with any matters specially objected against the same by himself or which may be required by any of the parties to be established.
