Defts

This cause came on this day to be again heard, on the papers formerly read, & was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, and it being suggested to the Court that the will belonging to the said Elizabeth Joyner dec^d and referred to in Commissioner Brown's report, and in the proceedings in this cause, is greatly decaying and likely to be greatly depreciated unless sold, and the rights of all parties injured thereby, the Court with the consent of all parties, adjudge, order and decree that Samuel Wells the Sheriff of the County of Southampton, proceed to sell before the Courtroom door of Southampton County, on some County Court day, after giving twenty days notice of such sale at the Courtroom and at four other public places in the neighbourhood of said property, the will belonging to the said Elizabeth Joyner dec^d and three acres of land attached, with all other privileges and appurtenances, and in making such sale the said Sheriff, is directed to make the same on a credit of six months taking bond and good personal security from the purchaser, with interest from date and return the title till the further order of the Court, and make report to Court. And it being suggested to the Court that Mrs. Lucy at Joyner widow of said Elizabeth Joyner dec^d has died since the commencement of this suit, whereby her interest in the lands of said deceased lease, it is ordered that the case be proceeded in against the other parties hereto notwithstanding her death. And it is further ordered that Wm. H. Daughton Administrator of Elizabeth Joyner dec^d proceed to render a further account of his transactions as such Administrator as directed by a decree of this Court made made in this cause at May Court 1865.
