 This cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly read & was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, and it being suggested to the Court that the mill belonging to the said Elijah Doyne &c and referred to in Beauchamp's Report, and in the proceedings in this cause is greatly decayed and likely to be greatly depreciated unless sold, and the rights of all parties injured thereby, the Court doth adjudge of all parties adjudge, order and decree that Samuel Hills the Sheriff of the County of Southampton proceed to sell before the Courthouse door of Southampton County or some County Court day, after giving twenty days notice of such sale at the Courthouse and at four other public places in the neighbourhood of said property, the mill belonging to the said Elijah Doyne's estate and three acres of land attached, with all his privileges and appurtenances, and in making such sale the said Sheriff is directed to make the same in a course of six months taking bond and good personal security from the purchaser, with interest from date of sale and until the further order of the Court, and make report to Court. And it being suggested to the Court that Mrs. Lucy at Doyne widow of said Elijah Doyne &c has died since the commencement of this suit, whereby her interest in the lands of said deceased ceased, it is ordered that the case be proceeded in against the other parties herein notwithstanding her death. And it is further ordered that Wm. H. Daughtrey administrator of Elijah Doyne &c proceed to render a further account of his transactions at such time and of as directed by a decree of this Court made and in this cause at attorney Court 1865.
