On consideration whereof the Court conferring said report to which no exceptions had been filed, doth approve, order and decree that Wille Edwards who is appointed as Commissioner for the purpose, after having ascertained the true value and value of the land by advertisement at the Court House door of this County, and as one or more places in the neighborhood, sell to the highest bidder out a credit of one and two years equal installments except each sufficient to pay the expenses of sale and costs of this suit, the tract of land in the bill of proceedings mentioned tract; a tract of land lying in the County of Southampton and containing 93 acres adjoining the land of John H. Rockwell father. That the Commissioner take bonds and security of the purchaser for the deferred payments remaining at least on the land until the purchase money is paid, and return the bond with his report to Court. And this decree shall be suspended until the said Wille Edwards or some one for him enter into bond and become in the Clerk's Office of this Court, before the Clerk, in the penalty of \$700.00 payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, conditioned to faithfully execute this and any other decree which may be made in this cause.
