But if partition cannot be conveniently made, then the Court may allot the entire subject to any party who will accept it, and pay therefor to the other party such sum of money as his interest therein may entitle him to; and the Court shall further adjudge, order & decree, that if partition cannot be conveniently made, said Court will report whether the interest of the parties will be promoted by a sale of the entire subject or allotment of part and sale of the residue; as to all of which proceedings the said Commissioners will make report to this Court, with any matters specially stated down occupying by them, or required by either of the parties.
