This cause came on this day to be heard on the papers formerly ready with
draft of the Decree made by the Supreme Court of Appeals on the 19th
Nov 1855, and was argued by counsel. On consideration taken of the
Decree (as directed by said Decree) both sides that all commission of
this Court take an account as referred to therein as of the 25th
day of June 1856, of all the price and proceeds timber thereon
the tract of Land in the Contract referred to measuring
fifteen inches in Diameter and upwards as the Stumps whether
before they were felled by the appellants under the said Contract
still standing in the woods and in the condition it then was, sub-
ject however to a deduction of the amount of the second and last
instalment of \$500. which was payable for said timber under
said Contract on the 1st day of September 1857, and make report
to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by
himself, or that any of the parties may require to be so stated.

Plaintiffs demands and of all outstanding debts against the estate
of Thomas C. Johnson dec. 3rd An account showing the amount
and absolute value of the real estate of which Thomas C. Johnson
dec. seized and possessed, which said account the Commissioners
shall to examine state and settle and make report there of to
the Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent
by himself, or which may be required by any of the parties
to be stated.
