The cause came on this day to be heard on the papers formerly ready with  
knowledge of the Court made by the Supreme Court of Appeals on the 18<sup>th</sup>  
April 1855, and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the  
Court (as directed by said decree) doth order that a commission of  
the Court take an account as referred to therein as of the 25<sup>th</sup>  
day of June 1856, of all the pine and poplar timber then on  
the Great Tract of Land in the contract referred to measuring  
fifteen inches in diameter and upwards at the Stump, which were  
before that time felled by the appellants under the said Contract  
still standing in the woods and in the condition it then was, sub-  
ject however to a deduction of the amount of the second and last  
instalment of £900. which was payable for said timber under  
said contract on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September 1857, and make report  
to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by  
himself, or that any of the parties may require to be so stated.

this Court shall the following accounts; 1st. An Account of

taking the account made out and returned to the County Court of  
Southampton as prima facie correct. 2d. An Account of the  
plaintiff demands and of all outstanding debt against the estate  
of Thomas C. Johnson &c. 3d. A Statement showing the annual  
and absolute value of the real estate of which Thomas C. Johnson  
did possess and dispose of, which said sum in the Commissioner's  
hands to examine the same and settle and make report thereon of to  
the Court with my matters specially stated deemed pertinent  
by himself or which may be required by any of the parties  
to be stated.
