

1st Day of June 1865 did find and to the legal guardian of Mollie, Patsy, and Anna Mallory a like sum with like interest being the money bequeathed by James H. Drury to the said parties in consideration of the land devised to his brother W^m H. Drury.

The Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that all commission of this Court take on account of the transactions of W^m H. Drury as Executor of James H. Drury, taking the separate amount filed as an exhibit in this cause as prima facie cannot liable to be discharged of said parties by either party and return the same to Court.

Also an account showing what funds came to the hands of W^m H. Drury as executor as aforesaid and how he has disposed of the same.

And the Commissioner will make such special statements as he may deem pertinent to which may be required by either of the parties to be so stated and as to all other matters and questions arising under the pleading in this case the cause is continued.

And the said Decree in favour of Mollie, Patsy, and Anna Mallory shall be suspended until their guardian has made bond and sufficient security in the Clerk's office of this Court in the penalty of two thousand dollars payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia conditioned faithfully to account for the amount received by him under this decree but this Decree as to the payment of money is subject to the provisions of the Statute law passed March 2nd 1866.

This cause this day came on to be heard in the bill of the plaintiff taken for complaint as to W^m Adicus Bailey and A. Atkinson and wife in the answer of the infant defendants, Erastus N. James Henry, Sophia Allen Ad^x and Henry Edward Bailey and general replication thereto in exhibits and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that one of the commissioners of this Court take the following accounts: 1st An account showing the value and amount of chattels and personal property belonging to the testator at his death and coming to the hands of Mary R. Bailey his Ad^x. 2nd An Account showing what amount of said chattels & personal property is now owing to keep up the farm and loaned to the widow for that purpose. 3rd An Account ascertaining the value of each of the specific legacies and of the property loaned the widow during her natural life. 4th An Account showing what amount is to be paid by each of the legacies to Henry Edward Bailey the putative child. 5th An Account of the transactions of Mary R. Bailey & Mary of Henry D. Bailey dec^d. 6th An Account of the debts outstanding against the estate of Henry D. Bailey deceased distinguishing their dignity and priority which said accounts the said Commissioner is directed to examine, state and settle and make report there of to this Court with any matters, specially stated deemed pertinent by any of the parties to be so stated.
