this suit and her d^rd and the cause coming on again to be heard on
the papers formerly read, and on the report of Commissioner Parker
made pursuant to the order of May term 1861, to which no
exception had been filed was argued by Counsel. On consideration
whereof, the Court confirming said report doth adjudge
order and decree that James H. Mangum who is appointed
Commissioner of the Court for the purpose after advertising
the time, place and time of sale at the courthouse of Southampton
County, and at other public places in the vicinity of said town
and, for at least thirty days before the day of sale, do proceed
to sell at public auction the land in the proceedings
mentioned of which William Mallory died seized containing
156.15 acres on a credit of nine months reserving so much
of the proceeds of sale in cash as will pay the expenses of
sale and the costs of this suit and for the balance of the proceeds
of sale take from the purchaser bond with good personal
security, to bear interest from the day of sale and payable
in monthly after date and report his proceedings to the
Court and the costs of this suit and for the balance of the proceeds
of sale shall be paid to the said Mangum Commissioner shall appear in
the Clerk's Office of this Court before the return thereof and
with good personal security in the penalty of \$500. payable
to the Commonwealth of Virginia conditioned for the faithful
performance of his duties as trustee under this decree, and such
other decrees as may be hereafter entered in this cause.
