- 3<sup>d</sup> A further account of the separate outstanding debts against debts against Joseph E. Billette dec'd.
- 4<sup>th</sup> A further account of the debts due by Billette & Britton.
- 5<sup>th</sup> A further account of the debts due by Britton, Vick & Co.
- 6<sup>th</sup> An account of the transactions between the firms of Billette & Britton and of Britton, Vick & Co.
- 7<sup>th</sup> An account of the real estate of Andrew J. Vick & its value & of all debts due by him and that he further ascertain what is the value of the assets of Billette & Britton, and of Britton, Vick & Co. and make report to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or that may be required by any of the parties to be so stated.
