3rd A further account of the separate outstanding debts against Andrew J. Vick against Joseph E. Gillette dec'd.

4th A further account of the debts due by Gillette & Pittet.

5th A further account of the debts due by Pittet, Vick & Co.

6th An account of the transactions between the firms of Gillette & Pittet and of Pittet, Vick & Co.

7th An account of the real estate of Andrew J. Vick & its value of all debts due by him and that he further ascertain what is the value of the assets of Gillette & Pittet, and of Pittet, Vick & Co and make report to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or that may be required by way of the parties to be so stated.
