Debt

This cause came on this day to be heard on the plaintiffs bill taken for confessing as to the defendants
Dempsey Dardur administrator of Wilson H. Dardur deceased Wm R. Lawrence Executor of Joseph T.
Lawrence deceased Francis Dardur, Jacob Austin and Emeline Austin his wife and John W. Dardur and they
still failing to appear and plead, answer and answer to the said bills on the answer of the infant defendant
Walter J. Dardur by L R Edwards his guardian ad litem assigned to defend him in this suit, general
objection statute, on the exhibits filed and was argued by counsel. On the hearing whereof the Court
did adjudge, order and decree, that Dempsey Dardur settle an account of his transactions as administrat-
or of Wilson H. Dardur deceased before one of the Commissioners of this Court, who is hereby directed to
take any account which he may have heretofore settled as Prison fees correct liable to be discharged and
settled by any of the parties interested, who will also report whether the said Dempsey Dardur has
paid over the balance reported due by him to Wilson H. Dardur here at law, also ascertain
whether the heirs at law of Wilson H. Dardur have received from him debts sufficient to pay the
plaintiffs demand, and what amount each debt pay - And the said Commissioner will also take
an account of the annual and actual value of lands wherof Wilson H. Dardur died buried and
interred, who is directed to examine, state and settle the same, and make report thereof to
this Court, together with any matters specially stated demand by himself, or which
may be required by any of the parties to be so stated.

adjudge, order and decree that Fortunatus Dunn settle an account of his transactions as administrator
of Mary E. Austin deceased also an account of Mary E. Austin's transactions as executrix of Chas B.
Austin deceased before one of the Commissioners of this Court. That Samuel Kelle administrator to him
and with the will annexed of Chas B. Austin deceased also settle his account before one of the Commissioners
of this Court, who is also to take an account of the debts outstanding against the estates of Mary E.
Austin and Chas B. Austin, and also an account of the annual and actual value of the land devised
by Chas B. Austin to his son Wm C. Austin, who is directed to examine, state and settle the
same, and make report thereof to this Court, together with any matters specially stated demand
presented by himself or which may be required by any of the parties to be so stated.
