This cause came on this day to be heard on the plaintiffs bill taken for confessed as to the defendants Dempsey Dardur administrator of Wilson H. Dardur dec^d W^m R. Lawrence Executor of Joseph J. Lawrence dec^d Francis Dardur Jacob Austin and Emeline Austin his wife and John W. Dardur and they still failing to appear and plead, answer and do unto the said bill on the answer of this infant defendant Walter J. Dardur by L. R. Edwards her guardian ad litem assigned to defend her in this suit, general replication thereto, on the exhibits filed and was argued by counsel. On the hearing whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Dempsey Dardur settle an account of his transactions as administrator of Wilson H. Dardur dec^d before one of the Commissioners of this Court who is hereby directed to take any account which he may have heard from Deft^s as parties, said account shall be discharged and satisfied by any of the parties interested, who will also report whether the said Dempsey Dardur has paid over the balance reported due by him to Wilson H. Dardur's heirs at law, also ascertain whether the heirs at law of Wilson H. Dardur have received from him assets sufficient to pay the plaintiffs demand, and what amount each should pay - and the said Commissioners will also take an account of the annual and actual value of lands whereof Wilson H. Dardur died seized and possessed, who is directed to examine, state and settle the same, and make report thereof to this Court, together with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself, or which may be required by any of the parties to be so stated.

Austin, and also an account of the annual and actual value of the land devised by Joseph B. Austin to his son W^m J. Austin, who is directed to examine, state and settle the same, and make report thereof to this Court, together with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which may be required by any of the parties to be so stated.
