This cause having been removed from the County Court of Southampton on motion of the plaintiff is this day dedicated and came on to be heard on the papers formerly read, and on the report of Commissioner W. H. Parker and the exceptions filed thereto by the infant defendant, and this Court overruling said exceptions and confirming said report, doth adjudge, order and decree that the Clerk of this Court deliver to W. H. Parker, who is appointed a Special Commissioner for the purpose, the books of W. H. Parker's account and Dominicus L. Dales, as named by him in his report of February 1866, that he collect the same and after paying the expenses of this decree pay to Anne E. Rollings one third of the balance and that he pay the remainder to the guardian ad litem of Louise V. Margaret D. Birch & Julia E. and William J. H. Rollings and make report to this Court in order to a final decree, but the latter part of this decree shall be suspended until the guardians of the said infants shall execute bond before the Clerk of this Court in the penalty of five hundred and payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia conditioned for the faithful performance of his trust as said guardian.
