This cause having been removed from the County Court of Southampton On motion of the plaintiff is this day docketed and came on to be heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of Commissioner W. H. Puckett and the exceptions filed thereto by the infant defendants, and this Court overruling said exceptions and confirming said report, doth adjudge, order and decree that the Clerk of this Court deliver to W. H. Puckett who is appointed a Special Commissioner for the purpose the bills of W. R. Stephenson and Demarcus L. Dale returned by him in his report of February 1866: that he collect the same and after paying the expenses of this decree pay to Ann C. Rollings one sixth of the balance and that he pay the remainder to the guardian ad litem of Louisa V. Margaret D. Sarah C. John C. and William J. W. Rollings and make report to this Court in order to a final decree, but the latter part of this decree shall be suspended until the guardian of the said infants shall come before the Clerk of this Court in the penalty of five hundred and payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia conditioned for the faithful performance of his trust as said guardian.

This day this cause came on to be again heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of Commissioner Howard made in pursuance to a decree of this Court rendered at November Term 1866 and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the report be recommended to the said Commissioner who is required to ascertain, the time and terms of the sale of James H. Drury, property made by William H. Drury his executor the time at which the Executor received the proceeds of the said sale, whether any money has been paid and from whom is still unpaid for purchases made at said sales, and what was the consideration thereof, in addition to the matters required by the order of November Term 1866. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that the Commissioner may examine in solemn form any of the parties touching the matters involved in this suit. The Commissioner will report to Court with any other matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or requested by either of the parties to be so stated.

Howard Commissioner made pursuant to the decree of the 7<sup>th</sup> of November 1866, and on the reports of Samuel H. H.
