Warren has made any inventory of his intestate's funds and if so in what manner and by whom and they also shall state the present money value of the balance he may report due in Confederate State currency, which account the said Commissioners will examine, settle and settle and report to Court with any matters of process stated therein pertinent by himself or which may be requested by any of the parties to be so stated
