Thomas D. Howell who has in behalf of himself and all other creditors of
Harrison D. Moore, late of Southampton, deceased, who shall come in
and contribute to the expense of this suit - } *Self.*

against
W^m W. Baigge late Sheriff Southampton and assigns of Harrison D. Moore, } *Deft.*
and Virginia and Rebecca Moore.

It appearing to the Court that Rebecca Moore, has attained the age of twenty one years
Since the last hearing of this Cause, it is Ordered that she be ^{now} proceeded on, in the
Name of the said Rebecca, and the Cause come on this day to be heard on the papers
formerly read, and in the report of Lemuel Howard, Made trustee the decedent of this Cause,
remains at November Term 1866, and was argued by Counsel. The Court declared that of
the ^{Court} Uniform said report, to which exception has been filed, and the previous hearing
Comprehended the debt, due from William Mumford, to wit: to W^m Baigge, both
D. Williams and Harrison D. Moore, one hundred, (and) stated in the Court
Report for the sum of \$3000, and it being agreed that within that sum shall be
paid, to said Bell in his assigned the said Bell shall be released, all of which
will appear by a statement filed in the Court of Bell vs. Mumford. Depending on
the Court, it is Ordered that the sum of \$3000, be paid, to the amount
due from Mumford and his Executors to Bell, instead of the amount reported by the
Commissioner. The Court doth adjudge, Order and decree, that W^m Baigge
who is appointed to Commission for the purpose, after giving thirty days previous
public notice, of the time, place and terms of Sale, by advertisement in some
Newspaper published in the City of Norfolk, and at the Court house here, of this
County, and at two or more public places in the Neighbourhood of the land, Sell
to the highest bidder at the Court house of this County, as a tract of One and two
years, equal instalments. Commencing instant from the day of Sale, except cash
sufficient to pay the Costs of this Suit and expenses of Sale, the real estate of
which H. D. Moore died seised, lying in Southampton County, Consisting of three
tracts, and containing in the aggregate 941 acres.

The Commissioner shall take Bonds with approved Surety, for the deferred
payments, and return the bills until the purchase money is fully paid, and return the
bills with his report to the Court.

But this decree shall be suspended until the said W^m Baigge Commissioner,
or some one for him enter into bond with sufficient Surety, in the penalty of
\$5000 in the Clerk's Office of this Court, and before the Clerk, payable to
the Commonwealth of Virginia, Conditioned faithfully to execute this and
any further decrees, which may be rendered in this Suit, touching the process
of the Sale of the real Estate hereby decreed. This decree is subject to the
provisions of the act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled "the act
to stay the Collection of debts for a limited period" passed March 23, 1866,
and the Court doth adjudge, Order and decree, that a Commissioner of
this Court, take a full and correct account of the outstanding debts against
the Estate of H. D. Moore, and report to this Court.
