Thomas D. Howell, who Sues me behalf of himself and all other Creditors of
Harmon D. Moore, late of Southampton deceased, who shall come in
and contribute to the expenses of this Suit - \$100-

W. W. Briggs late Sheriff Southampton and attorney of Harmon D. Moore did,
on the 1st December and before the Court - 3 Decr-

It appearing to the Court that Counsel attorney, has attained the age of twenty one years
since the last hearing of this Cause, it is Ordered that this be proceeded in, in the
Name of the said Counsel, and the Cause come on this day to be heard on the papers
formerly read, and in the report of Compt. H. H. Moore, made under the decree of this Court,
rendered at December Term 1856 and was argued by Counsel. The Consideration whereof
the Compt. has agreed to which exception has been filed, and the parties having
compromised the debt due from William Moore, he altho' W. W. Briggs, late
S. Williams and Harmon D. Moore, are Creditors, and stand in the same
(Report) for the sum of \$3000 and it being agreed, that when this sum shall be
paid, to said Bill or his assignee the said Bill shall be released, all of which
will appear by a Statement filed in the Suit of Bill vs. Moore. Depending on
this Report, it is Ordered that the sum of \$3000, be paid to the amount
due from Moore and his Executors to Bill, instead of the amount reported by the
Compt. The Court doth adjudge, Order and direct, that William W. Briggs
who is appointed a Commissioner for the purpose, after giving thirty days previous
public Notice, if the time, place and terms of Sale, by advertisement in some
Newspaper published in the City of Norfolk, and in the Court house town, of this
County, and at two or three public places in the Neighborhood of the Court, till
to the highest bidder at the Court house of this County, at a tract of One and two
years, equal installments, carrying interest from the day of Sale, except each
Borrower to pay the costs of the Sale and expenses of Sale, the real estate of
Richard H. D. Moore late Sheriff, lying in Southampton County, consisting of three
tracts, and containing in the aggregate 941 acres.

The Commissioner will take bond with sufficient Security, for the deferred
payments, and retain the title until the four hundred and fifty paid, and return the
title as in his report to the Court.

But this decree shall be suspended until the said W. W. Briggs Commissioner,
or some one for him enter into bond with sufficient Security, in the sum of
\$8000 - in the Clerk's office of this Court, and before the Clerk, payable to
the Commonwealth of Virginia, conditioned faithfully to execute this and
any further decree, which may be rendered in this Suit, touching the payment
of the debt of the real Estate hereby decreed. This decree is subject to the
provisions of the act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled "An act
to stay the Collection of debts for a limited period", passed March 3^d 1856.
and the Court doth adjudge, Order and direct, that a Commissioner of
this Court take & for their account of the outstanding debt against
the Estate of H. D. Moore, and report to this Court.
