and on the report of Commissioner Mangum, filed during the term, to which
no exception had been filed, and on the report of Commissioner Parker, and
the statement of J. H. Mangum under oath, and was argued by Counsel,
on Consideration whereof, the Court Concurring in the report of Commissioner
Mangum, doth adjudge, Order and decree, that the said Commissioner
James H. Mangum, pay to W. J. Goodey, the sum of forty one
dollars and forty cents, costs with interest on Seventeen dollars and
fifty cents theron from this day, and to Daniel Darrow administrator
of W. P. Mason, the sum of Eighty seven dollars and thirteen cents,
with interest theron from this day, in part of judgment
and the said Darrow from the estate of Said Mallory, the said
amount being the balance of the sum found for the sale of the real
estate in the hands of said Commissioner Mangum. And the Court
doth further adjudge, Order and decree, that the report of Commissioner
Parker be remitted to a Commissioner of this Court, who is
directed to enquire into and report to Court at what time of 1844
Mangum administrator of the Mallory estate, the debts and the
estate of his testator, the circumstances under which they were
accrued, and whether his position was prejudicial of them and the

Report of Commissioner Stewart made pursuant to the decree of May term 1843,
to which no exception had been filed, and on Statement (Marshall's) and
was argued by Counsel, on Consideration whereof the Court, Concurring said
report, doth adjudge, Order and decree, that William H. Brown, Executrix
of James H. Brown, and pay over & deliver to William E. Poines and his
wife Martha F. the following sum, to wit: the sum of Thirteen thousand
Eight hundred and forty five dollars and Seventy eight cents in Confederate
States Treasury Notes, the sum of Seven hundred dollars in Confederate
States bonds bearing eight per cent interest, the sum of One Thousand
dollars in Confederate States bonds bearing Seven per cent interest, and
the sum of three dollars and three cents with interest thereon from the
21st June 1843. And that the said Executrix pay over and deliver to the guardian
at Law of Battie Mallory, and Anna Mallory the following sum, to wit:
