This day this Court came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read,
and on the report of Commissioner Mangum, filed during the term, to which
no exceptions have been filed, and on the report of Commissioner Dodson, and
the statement of J. H. Mangum under oath, and was argued by Counsel.
On consideration whereof, the Court, confirming the report of Commissioner
Mangum, doth adjudge, Order and decree, That the said Commissioner
James H. Mangum, pay to W. S. Goodings, the sum of fifty and
fifty cents thereon from this day, and to Daniel Dodson administrator
of W. F. Macon, the sum of eighty seven dollars and thirteen cents,
with interest thereon from this day, in part of judgment
and the said Dodson from the date of said Mallory, the said
amount being the balance of the fund from the sale of the real
estate on the hands of said Commissioner Mangum. And the Court
doth further adjudge, Order and decree, that the report of Commissioner
Dodson be recommended to a Commissioner of this Court, who is
directed to enquire into, and report to Court at what time J. H.
Mangum administrator of Wm. Mallory assigns the debts due the
estate of his testator, the circumstances under which they were
assigned, and what disposition was made of them and the
Court doth further adjudge, Order and decree, that Commissioner
J. H. Mangum, make an account to Commissioner Applewhite, the
possessor of the real estate in the proceedings mentioned, a good
and lawful bond for the same, with Special Warranty.

report of Commissioner Howard filed pursuant to the decree of May term 1867,
to which no exceptions have been filed, and on statement (Exhibits A.) and
was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court, confirming said
report, doth adjudge, Order and decree, That William H. Drury, Executor
of James H. Brown, dec'd. pay over & deliver to William F. Brown and his
wife Martha F. the following sums, to wit: the sum of Thirteen thousand
Eight hundred and forty four dollars and seventy eight cents in Confederate
State treasury notes, the sum of Seven hundred dollars in Confederate
State bonds, bearing eight per cent interest, the sum of One Thousand
dollars in Confederate State bonds bearing Seven per cent interest, and
the sum of three dollars and three cents with interest thereon from the
21st June 1863. And that the said Executor pay over and deliver to the guardian
at Law of Sally, Mollie, and Anna Mallory the following sums to wit:
