Gardner dek. who was directed by the Sheriff of the May Term 1857, to settle his account of the said estate before one of the Commissioners of this Court, has failed to appear and do so, after having been duly notified for that purpose. Therefore the Court doth adjudge, Order and Direct, that a rule be issued against the said George Gardner, returnable to the next Court, to show cause if any he can, why an attachment should not be issued against him for a certain sum or sum of money offered to us in trust during our said Service.

This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly recd. and on the report of Commissioner Trelawny Moore pursuant to a Special Order entered in this cause at the November Term of this Court 1857, and was argued by Counsel, on consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, Order and Direct, that that part of the Commissioners report March 20<sup>th</sup> showing what amount of the personal estate of the deceased to Slonney Edwards Bailey, the posthumous child be confirmed, and that the widow Mary B. Bailey, pay to the legally qualified guardians of Slonney Edwards Bailey, the sum of Twenty three dollars and eight, tenth cents, and that James Henry Bailey pay the sum of Eighty five dollars and forty four cents to the same, and that trustees of Bailey pay to the same the sum of Thirty six dollars and fifty cents, and that William Bailey pay to the same the sum of Twenty five dollars and Twenty seven cents, it being the unpaid amount due against each of them in account of Commissioners agent. That the Court doth further, adjudge, Order and Direct, that one of the Commissioners of this Court, restore the account Master S. in account returned by Commissioner Trelawny, and in doing so direct he is directed to consider in said account, in including two boxes valued at fifty dollars, and eight chairs valued at four dollars, amongst the articles not necessary for the administration to keep up the farm. And the said Commissioner is also directed to state a further account of Mary B. Bailey's transactions as administrator of Henry S. Bailey a.t. which said account, he is directed to remain, State, hear and make return thereof to this Court, with any matter specially stated by himself, or which may be required to be so stated by any of the parties.
