 By Consent of parties this day the cause was docketed and came on to be heard on the Plaintiff's Plea, answer of the Defendants, general replications thereto, depositions filed, and was argued by Counsel, on Considerations whereof the Court doth adjudge. Order and decree, that W^m G. Holmes who is hereby appointed a Special Commissioner for that purpose, shall after having given at least twenty days notice of the time and place of Sale, at the Court House doors, and two or three places in the neighborhood proceed to sell at public auction to the highest bidder the land in the true Blounts to wit, Two hundred acres adjoining the lands of Shayses down and within New Berlin, whereof David H. Jeynes died seized and possessed, on the following terms to wit, Suffering in Cash to defray expenses of Suit and Sale, the balance in a credit of twelve Months falling from the purchase and to be paid with good and sufficient Security carrying interest from date, which said bond is directed to return to the Court together with a report of his proceedings under this decree. And the said W^m G. Holmes is not to execute the provisions of this decree until he shall give bond in the Clerk's office of this Court, with good and sufficient Security in the penalty of Twenty five hundred dollars payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia and Conditions for the faithful performance of the duties herein assigned him, and any other decrees which may be made in this cause, touching the proceeds of the real estate hereby directed to be sold.
