By Consent of parties this day this cause was docketed and came on to be
heard in the Plaintiff's suit, answer of the Defendants, general replications

having given at least twenty days Notice of the time and place of Sale,

of Springer's Farm and Briggs New Bedford, whereof David St. Joyce,
