And the Court doth further adjudge, Order and decree, That W<sup>t</sup> B. Shantz be appointed receiver in the place of Littleton R. Edwards, the resignation of the said L. R. Edwards having been accepted, to take effect at January first 1868.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow Mornington Clarke.

Thomas Ridley, Mary T. Ridley, Margaret B. Ridley, Sallie J. Ridley,

 It being suggested to the Court that Mary T. Ridley, has intermarried  
 with Nat T. Ridley. Since the last hearing of this cause, it is ordered  
 that she sue pro se in the name of her late Nat T. Ridley & wife, and  
 this day this cause came on to be heard on the papers formerly read,  
 and in the report of Commissioner Stewart, made under a Decree of  
 this Court rendered at November Term 1865, on State witness (A. H.)  
 and (B. H.) filed in this cause and was argued by Counsel, On Consi-  
 deration whereof the Court adopting said statemente rendered (A. H.) and  
 (B. H.) as the basis of this cause, doth adjudge, Order and  
 decree, That Thomas Ridley guardian for the children of Robert Ridley  
 doth pay and deliver to Robert Ridley the Plaintiff, Twenty five  
 hundred dollars of the bonds of the City of Petersburg, the same  
 amount of said bonds to Nat T. Ridley & wife and retain the same  
 amount of said bonds for each of his wards Margaret B. and Sallie  
 A. Ridley. The Court doth further adjudge, Order and decree, That  
 the said Thomas Ridley, pay over and deliver to the Plaintiff,  
 Robert Ridley, Twenty five thousand dollars in nominal value  
 of the 9 per cent Confederate bonds in his hands, the same amount  
 of said bonds to Nat T. Ridley & wife, and retain a like amount  
 for each of his wards Margaret B. & Sallie A. Ridley.  
 And the Court doth adjudge, Order and decree, That Thomas Ridley  
 pay to the Plaintiff Robert Ridley, the sum of Eight hundred  
 and Sixteen dollars and  $\frac{1}{4}$  cents, with interest thereon from  
 December 3<sup>rd</sup> 1865, till paid, to pay to Nat T. Ridley & wife  
 his wife, a like sum, with like interest, and retain a like sum,  
 with like interest for each of his wards, Margaret B. and Sallie  
 A. Ridley. And the Court doth further adjudge, Order and
