By consent of parties this Cause this day was settled, and came on to be heard at the plaintiff's bid, answer of the Defendant's general exception thereto, deposition taken, and was argued by counsel: the Court do allow interest of the County with advantage. Order and Decree, That Mrs. Moore, who is hereby appointed Special Commissioner for that purpose, shall after having given at least twenty days notice, of time and place of Sale, at the County House door and at two or three public places in the neighbourhood, present to Sell at public auction to the highest bidder, the tract of Land in the true Meritons whereof Madison J. Davis died Seignior and proprietor, lying on the West Side of Ince's Road, containing One Hundred and fifty acres, at the following Terms to Wit, Suffering in Cash to defray expenses of Suit and Sale, the balance on a Credit of Six Months, taking from the proceeds and with sufficient Security, carrying interest from date, retaining the title until the purchase money is paid. Which said Land he is directed to return to the County together with a report of his proceedings under this Decree, as But the said Mrs. Moore is not to execute the provisions of this Decree, until he shall have given bond with good and sufficient Security, in the Clerk's Office of this County, in the penalty of Six Hundred Dollars, payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties herein assigned him, and if any other Decree that may be hereafter entered in this Cause touching the proceeds of the said Estate hereby directed to be sold.

Ordered that the Cause be adjourned till tomorrow Morning ten o'clock.
