This cause came to this day to be again heard on the papers formerly read, and on the report of John R. Miller, Commissioner, made previous to the decree of the 7th of November 1866, and on a supplemental report the day filed by said Miller, to which report there is no exception made, argued by Counsel, as follows:—whereof the County Court confirm the said report, & doth adjudget, orders & deems it, that the said John R. Miller, be appointed receiver of the debts of this County, (the debt of the said John R. Miller to him in his bearing a receipt, therefore,) the sum of James Corlett & Charles Beale for two thousand & fifty seven dollars & forty three cents, filed in the cause and ordered the same & all interest thereon, and all of the present pay, and costs that may remain unpaid, there pay to himself the sum of two hundred & three dollars & sixteen cents, incurred by him in defending the suit in the County Court, interest thereon as referred to in said supplemental report; and there pay out of the balance the sum of eight hundred & fifty five dollars and twenty four cents, with interest from the 7th November 1866, as ascertained to be due by Commissioner Howard's report, to Lester R. Edwards, consta for A.W. Fletcher, as directed by the said Court, referred to in the decree of the said County Court, to be applied to the payment of said Party, and if any balance remains payable to Miller, C. Stephensons, in sum of forty two dollars & sixteen cents, against interest from the 7th November 1866, no further owing, amount due according to Commissioner Howard's Report. And if a balance should still remain pay the same to said Emily Stephensons, and if she & her husband have a balance to be awarded in the cause from to James Corlett for the same debt sold under process of law in this County, and make report to County.
