It being suggested that since the institution of this suit & the facts relied upon in this cause, C. W. Mapendury, the Plaintiff in the said cause, appeared before the Court, no Negligence of his, Mr. Dale, one of the parties to this suit, it is ordered that the name of William B. Stevens, the Justice having been appointed to substitute in his place, as Plaintiff, that the suit be thereafter prosecuted in the name of Mr. B. Stevens, as Plaintiff, only and throughout this cause on the day ensuing to his being so appointed, to which no exception shall be filed and may argue by counsel, or consideration whereof the Court shall adjudge, orders and directs, that the said Plaintiff be compensated, and that Mr. B. Stevens, so appointed, shall be in place of C. W. Mapendury, and in the course of time, executed by Geo. W. Dale, & wife, due to the said Mapendury as of 28th of December 1867, and that the said Mr. B. Stevens, shall draw from the papers in this cause & certain bills executed by James Hilday and Son, to C. W. Mapendury for James Hilday & Sons, for fifties dressing and laundry for laundry at the 1st of January 1868, and Collets in same, and the County shall further draw back the Compensation and the payment of the sum of Seven hundred & fifteen dollars, & twenty four cents, for the purchase of the real estate in the Bill mentioned, executors & heirs to the purchaser, except the land bought by James Hilday while married, severally -
