This Cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly
read and on the Report of John D. Cullen, Commissioner, signed pursuant
to the decree of the day of November 1869, (to which Report there
is no exception) and on the examination of witnesses, and was argued
by Counsel; the Consideration of the Court being confined to the said
Report, and their adjudge, order and decree, that John D. Cullen, as
Commissioner as aforesaid, receive of the Clerk of this Court, (who
then delivers the same to him on his filing a Receipt therefor,) the
Sum of \$100,000, of two hundred & fifty five dollars, and of J.
D. Cullen and John Cullen Jr, of two hundred and ninety two dollars
and eighty four cents, filed with the said Report, and ordered the
same and all interest thereon, and that he deposit the money
thus received, (after paying any further costs that may be due
and unpaid,) in the Safe Deposit Company, to the credit of
this Court to be drawn out by order of the Court; and that he
file in this Cause the Certificate of such deposit, and that
he make out to the Clerk of the Court, J. D. Cullen and James D.
Cullen, respectively, for the said estate purchased by them under
procuring note in this Cause, of the special proceeds in the
house found, and make report to Court; and all other questions
in the Cause and necessary for the future consideration of the Court
but if it is ordered that a Commissioner of this Court ascertain
the Judge's fees against Cullen, Cullen and James Cullen
Surviving partners of said William and Cullen, decd in
Northampton County and their assigns and privies, and make
report to Court.
