This day this cause came in again to be heard on the papers formerly
read and the report of Commissioner Howard made pursuant to a decree
and order of the Honorable Court, 1847, of this Court and to exhibit in evidence
two facts, and I appearing to the Court from the suggestion
of the Plaintiffs that to the Mesfurther Law of James Wills dead, they
defective this life since the said decree awarded in this cause,
and that the estate of the said James Wills has two Commissions in
the hands of J. L. Dole, late Sheriff of Southampton County for further
administration and that the said J. L. Dole having neglected
further process to be made, partly dependent to the said in
place of E. W. Mesfurther and not arriving suffering after in
his hands to answer the demands of the Plaintiffs as administrators
he long time against the said account of James Wills dead - Whereas
they said estate arrived in his hands as a defendant in this
suit, the consideration of having then Court date opening, Order
and decree, by Consent of parties, that the said report be confirmed
and that the said J. L. Dole, administrator of James Wills dead -
pay to the proper execution of James W. Messers the sum of
Eighty three dollars in thirty three cents, with interest
from the 14th of November 1842, and to the proper execution
of Matthias H. Messers the sum of Eighty three dollars and
thirty three cents with interest from the 14th of November 1842,
and the Court date further opening, Order, and decree that upon
the payment of the said sums of money to the said Messers
of the said James W. and Matthias H. Messers by the said J. L.
Dole, return that W. W. Briggs order be accordingly appointed a
Special Commissioner for that purpose, that by the said W. W.
Briggs take the said right, title and interest which the
said Plaintiffs have of, in and to, a tract of Land (hereinafter
described) and thirty three and one half acres, and in the
occupancy of the said John Charles, and the Court date
further opening, Order and decree, that the said J. L. Dole
administrator of James Wills pay to the said Plaintiffs the
costs which they have in this behalf expended.
