This day this Cause came or again to be heard on the papers formerly read and on the Report of Commissioner Tyler, and before Commissioner Wm. H. Stevens, before I Seal'd & Deliv'd to Plaintiff at Albany, on the 2^d instant, to which no exceptions have been filed and was argued by Counsel, on Consideration whereof, the Court by Council of party and upon lack of this sum, doth adjudge, order and decree that the said Report be confirmed and that W. H. Stevens, the Commissioner appointed to seal the same, make out Bill from the Office of the Clerk, and an Order in the Name and upon the payment of all the just and necessary Costs, Duties, &c. for purchasing and preparing of a copy of the Report by giving the same in order to be further stored, and the appearance before Commissioner Tyler's Report of the 27th January 1871, that there is a balance in the hands of David H. Stevens' power to pay and distribute for unto of his Creditors the debts private debts of other having with him, Brigard and Roberts his wife, Amanda Stevens, Sonora Elliz, Richard Eddy and Thomas Elliz and the balance pay to Edgar W. Belter and Elizabeth his wife their debt being a Thousand dollars and as to all other matters the same is confirmed.
