answ<sup>r</sup> of H. S. Godington Executor of Sam'l Drury dec<sup>d</sup> in his own right, & also as admt<sup>r</sup> of Samp'l  
Drury dec<sup>d</sup> and on the answer of Mary Ann Godwyn by H. S. Godington his next friends, and replied  
to said answers were determined of interplea, and was argued by Counsel; on Consideration whereof,  
the Court (without deciding any question involved in the Cause) did adjudge order and directed that at Comm<sup>ss</sup>  
of the Courts State and State the accounts of said H. S. Godington as Executor of Sam'l Drury dec<sup>d</sup>,  
and especially payment of said debts of said H. S. Godington and also a certified account of the signature of said  
Drury deceased, being the account heretofore returned to the County Court of Southampton County & which

Sheriff appointed to sell six hundred and fifty acres of land belonging to Samuel A. Billito estate and to whom report  
no written have been filed and not argued by counsel. On Consideration whereof the Court did adjudge order and  
directed the said report be confirmed and that W. H. Briggs Sheriff as aforesaid withdraw the lands from the
