 It appearing to the Court that Wm. Ashburn, administrator of George S. Ashburn dec. has died and that
 John C. Ashburn has duly qualified as his executor and also as administrator de bono non of Geo. S. Ashburn dec.
 and that the said last fully named by said George S. Ashburn as executor of said Geo. S. Ashburn
 dec. and administrator de bono non of George S. Ashburn dec. has caused the said estate of George S. Ashburn
 dec. to be properly inventoried and a Commissioner's report of the 1st of May 1871. to which report
 there is no exception and was agreed by consent. On consideration thereof the Court did confirm the said report
 and did adjudge said John C. Ashburn that the said Thomas J. Ashburn is executor of said Geo. S. Ashburn dec.
 out of the sum of one thousand six hundred and fifty one dollars and seventy two cents, and the interest
 on one thousand five hundred and ninety five dollars and ninety four cents paid thereof from the 1st of June 1870
 due by said Geo. Ashburn to the estate of said George S. Ashburn dec. as appears by account no. 1. of
 said Commissioner's report, for the debt due by said George S. Ashburn & adjusted by account no. 2.
 of said Commissioner's report, that is to say, To John A. McElwain the sum of one hundred
 and eight dollars and forty five cents (108.45) with interest on thirty dollars from 1st June 1870
 To E. R. McElwain thirty dollars and twenty four cents with interest on thirty five dollars and fifty cents
 from same time, To A. S. Stephens five dollars and forty three cents with interest on four dollars and
 forty three cents above, To A. S. Stephens thirty four dollars and fifty cents with like interest on thirty
 one dollars and eighty cents, To Geo. A. Hensley one hundred and twelve dollars and fifteen cents
 with like interest on one hundred and two dollars & cents - To John A. Hensley two hundred and
 eighteen dollars and fifty cents with like interest on one hundred dollars - To W. B. Smith one hundred
 dollars with interest on ten dollars as above. To John A. Hensley nine dollars eighty cents with like
 interest on eight dollars and seventy five cents - To J. C. Slaughter eleven dollars and fifty five cents
 with like interest on ten dollars - To Wm. B. Smith seven dollars and sixty eight cents with like interest
 on six dollars and eighty cents. To J. S. Smith twelve dollars and seventy five cents with like interest on
 eleven dollars & fifty cents - To J. S. Smith forty four dollars and twenty four cents with like interest
 on forty one dollars and fifteen cents - and out of the residue of said fund pay to John C. Ashburn
 attorney for Esther C. Ashburn widow of said George S. Ashburn dec. one third thereof, as her debited
 share of the said fund and the rest out of the residue that may still remain pay to Geo. B. Smith and
 W. B. Smith's attorney, each a fee of twenty five dollars and make report to Court.
 And ordered that John A. Hensley and Pelia his wife and Edward A. Ashburn, Henry Ashburn
 and Charles his wife and John A. McElwain and Prudence his wife, be summoned to say whether
 they will bring being their administrators, into Court to be sworn and, they file their answers to and
 summons as before in this Court - said summons to be returnable to the next Term
 of this Court.
