Lewis and for their Heirs and assigns and twenty one and 1/2 pence each payable respectively one year and three years from the 15th day of January 1874 with interest from that date, returns with the report of said assignee, which said the said W. P. Haydon is hereby authorized and required to collect as they severally fall due, with principal and receive payment of the same before maturity, should the obligors so desire, and the present thereof after paying interest the unpaid parts of the said debt apply in payment of the several debts named in Cunningham's Report under the name of Lewis, in their order of priority as therein reported, and the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree, that on the payment in full of said debt, the said W. P. Haydon (who is hereby appointed assignee in Bankruptcy for that purpose,) shall receive and deliver to the said W. P. Lewis a good and sufficient deed in fee simple with special warranty for the land in these proceedings mentioned, parcelled by being to wit, Round Hill tract in Bocking, containing by estimate One hundred and fifty acres, more or less, and a tract or Black Creek of Fifty acres, more or less, and eight reports of land of his proceedings under the above, returning with said Report the principle of the parties for the payments herein directed.
