This day the said cause was again heard in the papers formerly read and the
Report of Commissioner Taylor made pursuant to an order of the Court, County
Southampton entered at the December Term 1878, and to which Report no Order
was then filed, and was argued by Counsel, on Consideration whereof, the
Court Confirming its said Report and it appearing from the same that W. H.
Briggs the Sheriff, has no assets in hand and that the rents and profits of the
Land will not pay the debts in five years, the Court doth adjudge, orders
and decree, that the Sheriff of Southampton shall after having given,
at least twenty days notice of the time and place of holding public
advertisement, at the Court house or in the immediate vicinity of the
Land purposed to sell at public auction, to the highest bidder, to
Proceed, on some County Court day, the trial of said cause being
held at the Quaker Church in Southampton County, whereby the
W. Foyne's debt being now paid off, is subject to his administration
to be paid down in the following terms, to-wit, sufficient Cash to
pay the expenses of sale and costs of this suit including a sum
of Thirty dollars to W. H. Richard the Plaintiff's Counsel,
and the balance of the summons money to a credit of one
two and three years taking from the commencement thereof
apprised security, coming into the court day of sale,
and return the said Bond along with his Report to Court
in Order to a final decree.
