Sloane, this day returned, & which no exceptions have been filed, and was argued by Counsel. On Consideration
whereof the Court confirming said report, doth adjudge order and direct that until the said Sale of
Witlock's land and for land shall pass to the said Commissioner Cardinal as is before the 10th day of
January next the said lands in his behalf retained, amounting to the sum of five hundred and forty nine
Acres and twenty nine rods, with interest demand from the 15th December 1871, the said W. S. Gentry who is
elector Commissioner of the Court for the purpose, after having given notice of the time, place and terms
of sale at the Court House of the County of Washington and two or more public places in the vicinity
of the land in the proceedings mentioned, collect lands, days before the day of sale, forced to sell at
