This day the Court came out to be further heard on the papers formerly read and the report of the Hon. H. Harris Commissioner filed January 15th 1872 respecting sale of land in the proceedings mentioned, and asking for instructions from the Court for what manner to proceed the proceeds of the land found among the parties entitled under the will of Lewis Harris dec'd. and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court, conforming to said sale reported in said report of January 15th 1872 on motions being filed thereto, and being of opinion that the true intent and meaning of the 3^d Stm of Lewis Harris will, and that the two daughters of Lewis Harris should receive three hundred dollars apiece above his two sons, from the proceeds of the land sold reported in the report of January 15th 1872, doth adjudge, order and decree that the Hon. H. Harris, Commissioner assign the land of Lewis E. Harris, filed in this Court for seven hundred and sixteen dollars and ninety nine cents, collect the same and out of the proceeds, pay to Lewis E. Harris three and twenty nine dollars and twenty four cents, from the estate with interest thereon from January 15th 1872, to the Hon. H. Harris three hundred and twenty nine dollars and twenty four cents, with like interest, to Mrs. E. Harris and George J. his wife twenty nine dollars and twenty four cents, with like interest, to the legally qualified Guardian of Eugene H. and Adelaide Briggard, twenty nine dollars and twenty four cents, with like interest. And the Court doth further decree that when the land of Lewis E. Harris is paid, that the Hon. H. Harris, Commissioner, execute to him a deed with special warranty for the real estate, reported sold in the report of January 15th 1872. And the said Hon. H. Harris will make report of his proceedings under this order, in order to confirm doctd.

Showing the same with any other matter deemed pertinent by himself or which may be required to be so stated by any of the parties interested.
