This day the cause came on to be further heard on the present generally ready and the report of the H. Harris Commissioner filed January 15th 1878, respecting sale of land in the proceedings mentioned, and asking for instructions from the Court in what manner to divide the proceeds of the land purchased among the parties entitled under the will of Lewis Harris dec'd, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court, Considering the said sale reported in said report of January 15th 1878, no objection being filed thereto, and being of opinion that the true intent and meaning of the 3^d clause of Lewis Harris' will, and that the two daughters of Lewis Harris should receive three hundred dollars apiece from the proceeds of the land sold reported in the report of January 15th 1878, doth adjudge, order and decree that the H. Harris, Commissioner against the land of Lewis E. Harris, filed in this Court for several hundred and sixteen dollars and ninety nine cents, collect the same and out of the proceeds pay to Lewis E. Harris three hundred and twenty nine dollars and twenty four cents with interest thereon from January 15th 1878 to the H. Harris three hundred and twenty nine dollars and twenty four cents with like interest, to Mrs. E. Turner and Eliza J. his wife twenty nine dollars and twenty four cents with like interest, to the legally qualifying Guardian of Eugene St. and Adelaidie Channing, twenty nine dollars and twenty four cents with like interest. And the Court doth further decree that over the land of Lewis E. Harris it is paid, that the H. Harris, Commissioner, account to him a debt with several years past due in the sum of one thousand dollars and twenty four cents, and the same to be paid to the H. Harris with such report of his proceeding under this order, in order to afford security.
