 Report of Commissioners (Briggs), Subject of Cause this day filed by law
 of Court which said report is confirmed, the consideration whereof
 the Court did signify Order and decree, that Wm. H. Scarlett be
 and he is hereby appointed a Commissioner for the purpose
 that the said Scarlett sell at auction after hearing
 duly advertised the same in a public place, time and
 place, except sufficient cash to defray the expenses of the
 Court, the land of said John Scarlett lately died Judge
 and supposed, being in Northampton County, supposed to contain
 fifty acres, more or less, and bounded by the lands of John Rogers,
 John Rogers, and others, that the said Commissioner take from the
 purchase money and sufficient personal security for the
 payment of same, return the same to Court, with his report, and
