Term 1867, of the County Court of Washington, has not given any bond and refuses to give the same: The Court doth adjudge order and decree that the dector of the County Court dated at September Term 1867, and Oct. Term 1867, be amended, so that the same shall be as follows, to-wit: Whereas it was held during the session of a special Commissioner for the purpose that he should be authorized to sell the real estate owned by Simon Pope and his heirs, leaving to him any further notice of kind, place and terms of sale upon the following terms to-wit: namely that in every exposure of said estate - the balance in account of ad. tax and three per cent. equal annual payments, the purchaser to execute and with approved security, guaranteeing interest, from day of sale, and the title to be not made for the defendant personally. And in case the purchaser should refuse to pay cash for the said real estate, the Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute the same. But the said Commissioner will not proceed to execute this order until he shall have returned into bond in the Dector's Office of this Court, in the penalty of two thousand dollars, conditioned to faithfully execute the any further order of this Court in this cause; and said Commissioner is ordered to make report to Court of his proceedings under this order to Court.
