This Court came on this day to 10 again hear as the paper formerly read and at the Report of Mr. Justice Sheriff of Southampton County made pursuant to Order of Court 18th Inst, to which Allegeant there is no objection, and at the Petition of R. S. Ferguson affixed by James B. Ferguson date this day filed, and was argued by Counsel, Mr. Ferguson, also ex parte the Clerk Clerk, Counsel the said Report, and doth agree, order and decree, that until the Defendants shall make up to the Plaintiff's demands as established by Commission of the said Report of Sept. 18th 1873, that they be all Deemed Sheriff of Southampton County bound to have at their or their County Court day before the said Court day in December, Society of the Friends whereof Chas H. Ferguson did sign and appear, and directed in Commission of said Report of Contracting with several persons among them in the payment of one Thalating sum of £1000 in said Report, which sum and the same in the County of Southampton Virginia. That on payment there of the said Allegeant, Sheriff aforesaid, is directed to be so much only of said sum, and in such parcels, as may be necessary for the purpose of this suit, and that before any such sum paid by the said Sheriff the same shall be accounted as sum Court day previous to the day of suit, at the Great-horned Inn of said County and other public places in said County or in Town whereof published in Suffolk City for three weeks, which date above is made on 2^d Oct. Credit of one, two and three years, in equal parcels except for £1000 sufficient to pay the costs of this suit and expenses of suit, which may be required in Court, taking debts into good security from the parishes thereof, allowing reasonable exemption as returnable to the said Court as to original trial by this Court, and before his Report to the Clerk.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until morning next Oct. 7th
